Please encourage participants to **stay at home** (or have someone at home) to receive **IMP** up until **1pm** on the **expected day of package delivery**.

This is particularly **important** on the **Friday** before a **Bank Holiday!**

- All **leavers** have a **stop date entered** on your site's **delegation log**.

Did you know....



- In **1025** a Persian philosopher named Avicenna completed his work 'The Canon of Medicine' and is considered the first person to describe the **practice of testing different drugs**.
- In **1747** British naval surgeon James Lind conducted the **first clinical trial** (published 1753) of potential cures for Scurvy.
- The word "**placebo**" first appeared in medical literature in the early 1800s. Hooper's medical dictionary in **1811** defined it as "an epithet given to any medicine more to please than benefit the patient". (PANORAMIC is an **Open Label** trial, so everyone is aware of IMP allocation and no placebo is required.)
- Ronald Aylmer Fisher (during 1920s/30s) and Austin Bradford Hill (during 1940s/50s) were both influential in the **development of randomisation in treatment assignment**.
