




What is the trial about?


	1.	COVID-19 is caused by a new virus that makes lots of people poorly.
	2.	Some people get more poorly with the virus.
	3.	There is not yet a medicine that can stop you getting poorly and going to hospital.

	<p>We want to find a new medicine to help people get better quicker.</p> <p>We are testing some new medicines which may help people but might not yet have a licence for use in the UK.</p> <p>A doctor or nurse will tell you if the new medicine given to you, is safe for you.</p>




Who can take part?



 <p>OR</p>  <p>WITH</p> 	5.	<p>Anybody 50 years old or older</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Anyone aged 18-49, and you have a health problem that may mean you are more vulnerable</p> <p>WITH</p> <p>A positive test for the virus, and you are unwell with COVID-19 symptoms, which started in the past 5 days.</p>
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	6.	<i>These symptoms may include, shortness of breath, feeling unwell, muscle pain, diarrhoea, vomiting, fever, or cough.</i>
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What will happen if I take part?




	7.	Please visit our trial website to register for the trial.
	8.	You will fill in a short form online to check that you can take part.
	9.	Your care will not be affected, whether or not you do take part in the trial.



	10.	You will fill in an online consent form. You will answer questions about yourself and how you are feeling.
	11.	<p>You get to choose a 'trial partner'. This is somebody that will help you with the study.</p> <p>Add their details to the form.</p>
	12.	The information that you give us will be shared with your Dr and the study team, so that they can check everything is right.



	13.	You will get a phone call from your Dr or research team to tell you if you are suitable to take part.
	14.	You will be randomly entered into a group:


The different groups

	15.	<p>Group A:</p> <p>You will get normal care for your symptoms.</p>
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		<p>Group B:</p> <p>You will get one of the new medicines that we are testing. You will also get normal care from a Dr or nurse.</p>
	<p>16.</p>	<p>You will be told how to take the medicine.</p>
	<p>17.</p>	<p>If you are a participant capable of becoming pregnant, we will ask you to do a pregnancy test and confirm it is negative. We will provide the pregnancy test</p>


		for you to take at home. This is needed only if you are in group B.
	18.	Whatever group you are in, you will fill in an online diary every day for 28 days, so we know how you are feeling.
	19.	Some people will be asked to give samples during the study (nose and throat swabs and finger prick blood tests). These will help the study team understand the effect of the

		<p>medicines on the virus.</p> <p>This part of the study is optional.</p>
	20.	<p>If you are in group B, we will telephone you after you receive medication, to see how you are.</p>
	21.	<p>We will call you or send you a text message reminder if you forget to complete your daily diary or if you cannot answer questions online.</p>


	22.	Please tell us if you go to hospital.
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What will happen to my information?

	23.	<p>We will use the information to find out which treatments work.</p> <p>We may also look at your medical notes for information about you and your illness.</p>
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
	24.	We will keep information about you safe. We will not put your name on anything.
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What is the disadvantage of taking part?


	25.	Some medicine you take can make you feel poorly. Tell us on your daily diary how you feel each day and if you have bad symptoms.
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	<p>26.</p>	<p>A study Dr will monitor your symptoms and contact you or your Dr if needed.</p> <p>You can also call us if you need help.</p>
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
What is the advantage of taking part?

	<p>27.</p>	<p>You will help find a medicine for COVID-19.</p>
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Will I get money for taking part?

	28.	To say thank you we will give you a £10 gift voucher when you have finished.
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What if I want to stop the trial?


	29.	You can stop if you want to. You will still be looked after.
	30.	We will use the information and samples you gave us before you stopped.
